### State Ballot Measures:

#### **SUPPORT**

WON - **[Proposition 68 – California Drought, Water, Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection, and Outdoor Access For All Act of 2018.](#)** California Drought, Water, Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection, and Outdoor Access For All Act of 2018 would authorize \$4 billion in general obligation bonds for state and local parks, environmental protection and restoration projects, water infrastructure projects, and flood protection projects.

#### **OPPOSE**

WON - **[Proposition 70 – Greenhouse Gas Reduction Reserve Fund.](#)**

The measure would require a one-time, two-thirds vote of the legislature in 2024 on the distribution of greenhouse gas reduction funds generated by the cap-and-trade program. For more information, [click here](#).
